Officially established in 1921 with a bequest from Nelson businessman and philanthropist Thomas Cawthron, we have a century-long legacy of delivering world-class science that helps to protect our natural environment, the sustainable growth of New Zealand's primary industries, and the wellbeing of our people.

Thomas Cawthron had a vision that science could contribute to a young New Zealand. Motivated by this passion, in 1902 he made his will, leaving the bulk of his estate to establish a research institute. It was the single largest bequest in New Zealand at the time and laid the foundations for the Cawthron Institute.

Thomas Cawthron's legacy is realised everyday by our 300 highly qualified scientists, technicians and specialist staff who come from all over the world to undertake research that makes a lasting difference to the improved management of our freshwater and coastal ecosystems and growth of our blue economy.

Types of bequests.

There are three main types of bequests:

Specific: This is leaving a set amount. For example, 'I (name) hereby give \$50,000 to the Cawthron Foundation'.

Residual: This is all, or a nominated percentage of the remaining funds after providing for family/and or friends. For example, 'I (name) hereby give the residue of my estate to the Cawthron Foundation'.

Percentage: You may nominate a percentage or fraction of your estate. For example, 'I (name) hereby give 10 percent of my estate to the Cawthron Foundation'.
